Date of competition

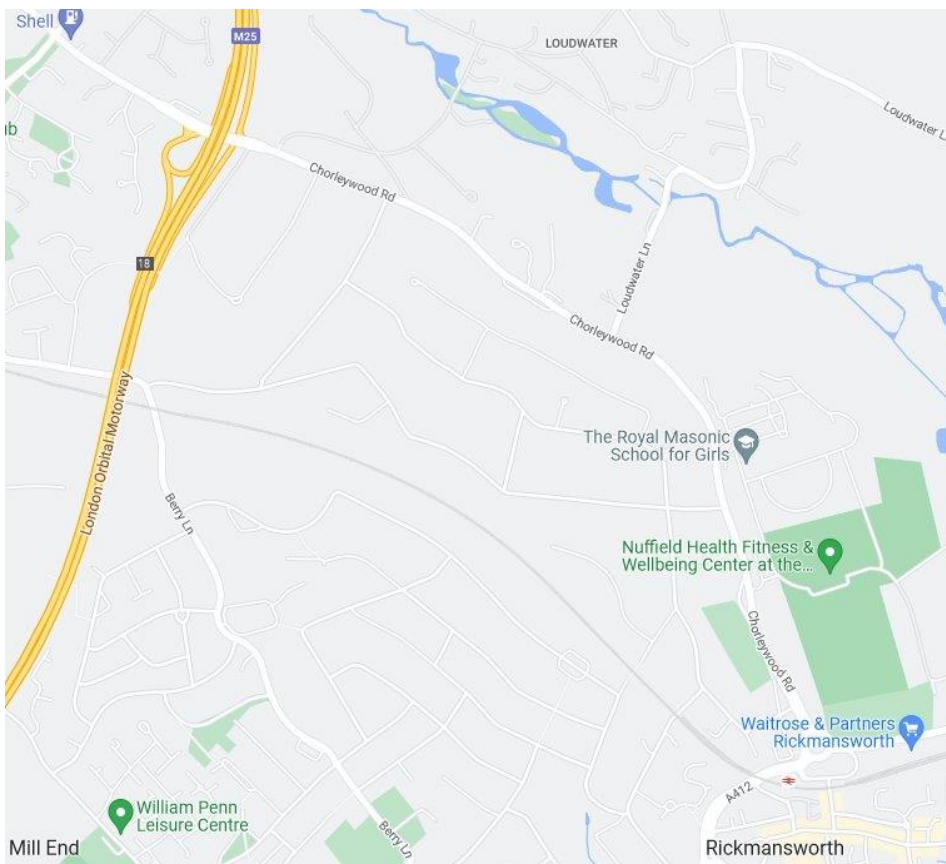
Sunday 3rd November 2024

How to get there

Venue: Nuffield Health Fitness Centre and Wellbeing Centre, Royal Masonic School (RMS) for Girls, Chorleywood Road, Rickmansworth, Hertfordshire WD3 4HF

Car: Exit M25 at Junction 18. One mile via Chorleywood Road, turn left via entrance for RMS school - free parking - then five-minute walk down pedestrian-only walkway to Nuffield Centre.

Rail: Rickmansworth  (Metropolitan line, zone 7)  (Euston line)
From station venue is 6-10 minutes' walk uphill, then right via RMS school gateway.



Running order

- 9am - 10am Competitors' registration including weigh-in
- From 10.15am Spectator entry
- 10.30am Championships begin

The running order for the competition will be displayed on the day.

Registration deadline

- Midnight, Sunday 20th October 2024
- Online entries only at <https://bccma.com/Events/2024-national-tai-chi-tui-shou-pushing-hands-championships-nov-3/>
- No entries will be accepted after this date
- Any certificates issued will use spelling from these forms. There will be a £5 charge to correct certificates on the day

Entry requirements

- Aged 7 years old and over
- You and your coach (if applicable) have read, understood, and agree with this Competition Pack and the Competition Rules located at <https://bccma.com/rules/>

Entry fees

Competitors:

- Adult BCCMA members: £25 per event
- Junior (under 18 years old) BCCMA members: £20 per event
- Adult Non-BCCMA entrants: £35 per event
- Junior Non-BCCMA entrants: £25 per event

- **Standard tickets**- available online only, up to the day before the competition:
£15 per person
- **Family tickets**- available online only, up to the day before the competition. Children under 5 years old go free:
£20 Family of 2 (1 adult and child aged 5-15 years old)
£25 Family of 3 (2 adults maximum)
£30 Family of 4 (2 adults maximum)
£35 Family of 5 (2 adults maximum)

Tickets bought on the door: £20 per person, cash only

You must bring proof of payment i.e. Product/Order ID number to exchange for wristbands. Please ensure you wear your wristband at all times.

The BCCMA will be filming all bouts. You will be able to access videos via the BCCMA's YouTube Channel.

You are welcome to film from the bleacher (tiered/raked) seating. Please do not film close to the mats or crowd control barriers.

If you promote your club on social media, please be respectful of other athletes and their clubs. Regarding children under 18 years old, extra safeguarding standards should be applied.

Access behind any crowd control barriers is only for Officials and Helpers (with official wristbands) and athletes (and corner person if sparring) about to compete. No more than three bouts in advance of when the competitor is due to compete.
