

4th World Taiji Championships 💥

August - A Global Stage for Team GB 4th World Taiji Championships in Singapore

Team GB Taiji represented Great Britain with pride on the world stage, delivering awe-inspiring performances.

September 2024 saw the hosting of the 9th World Junior Wushu Championships by the Brunei Wushu Federation. Great Britain sent the same junior wushu team as it did in 2022, namely Kehan Chen, Dominik Liu and Yavor Iliev. Unfortunately Yavor was unable to compete due to picking up an ankle injury right before the competition. Kehan Chen managed a respectable 5th place in the world for boy Changquan group B. Kehan also finished top 8 for his group B Gunshu performance, whilst Dominik Liu secured an impressive top 8 finish for group A male Jianshu. All in all a very memorable trip and a great experience for the junior team, beating the number of top 8 finishes of 2 set in their first WJWC in 2022.

Great Britain's top wushu athlete Sam Mak, secured a double position at the 3rd Taolu World Cup by way of 4th and 6th place finishes at the 16th World Wushu Championships in Dallas in 2023. Sam headed out to Tokyo in October as the first British athlete ever to qualify for the sport's showpiece event consisting of onlythe very best Wushu athletes from around the world. Having qualified for both Qiangshu and Jianshu, Sam managed an impressive 4th place in Qiangshu and was literally a 2cm jumping kick rotation away from a bronze medal in Jianshu. This was an even more impressive feat considering that Sam had been injured for most of 2024 and had only managed 4 training sessions before Tokyo.





22/09/2024 - Taiji Judging course

Peter Warr, President of BCCMA, and Simon Watson, Head of Taiji and Push Hands, delivered an in-depth course providing invaluable knowledge on IWUF rules for Group A and B Taiji judging. September to November - Workshops and Championships







27/10/2024 - Wushu Bingdao Workshop

The first-ever Wushu Bingdao workshop was a resounding success, promoting this unique art in UK by Payam Ezad Panah, a member of Wushu BingDao committee of WKFE.
